Annual Parish Meeting Sunday, Jan. 22, 2017 – 10 a.m.

We will have one service only this Sunday as we join parishioners of all three services together for our annual meeting. The service will be at 10:00 am followed immediately by the Parish meeting and Trinity Corporation meeting. The purpose of these meetings is to receive written reports from 2016 and elect new members to the Vestry and Trustees. This year we will be electing four (4) people to serve on the Vestry for a three (3) year term and one (1) person to serve as a Trustee for a five (5) year term. Those nominated for the Vestry are: Bonnie Atkinson, Scott Townsend, Rachel Hillis, Mark Grisham; and as a Trustee: Cliff Darby.

Our church canons and by-laws require that "members of the vestry must be parishioners sixteen (16) years of age or older who are communicants in good standing and who are regular financial contributors to the parish." Likewise, a "communicant in good standing" is defined as one who is known to the rector and wardens, is a financial giver of record, and has received Holy Communion at least three (3) times over the course of a year. We hold our Trustees to meet the same requirements. Our by-laws also require that one year lapse before a former member of the vestry who has served a full term can be re-elected.

Nominations from the floor will be allowed at the meeting on Jan. 22, with the knowledge that anyone nominated from the floor must give their consent and must meet all eligibility requirements. If no nominations are received from the floor, we will proceed with the election.

Please feel free to contact me, or one of the Wardens, should you have any questions. I look forward to gathering with you at our annual meeting this Sunday. Please plan to stay after the meeting and support our EYC as they serve lunch as part of their Trinity Annual Meeting fund raising event.

Trinity Welcomes Bishop Sloan on Jan. 29

On Sunday, January 29, Trinity will welcome The Rt. Rev. John McKee Sloan as he will preside at our 10:30 service of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation.

It is always a special time when one of our bishops comes to visit as we have a chance to speak with him about our diocese and wider church. The Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church state that every congregation within a diocese is to be visited by the Bishop at least once every three years. We are fortunate in this Diocese to receive a visit annually by the Bishop. During the visitation, "the visiting Bishop shall preside at the Holy Eucharist and at the Initiatory Rites, as required, preach the Word, examine the records of the Congregation ... and examine the life and ministry of the Clergy and Congregation." (From Canon III.24.4(b)) This is a fancy way of saying that the Bishop will preside at the service, administer the rites of Confirmation, preach, and look at the state of the parish by being with the clergy and members of the congregation.

During our Sunday School time, Bishop Sloan will be in Mullen Hall and available to the congregation for questions and conversation. At the service, Bishop Sloan will confirm seven (7) adults and five (5) youth. We only have these visits once a year so please take the time to come and visit with Bishop Sloan. Following the service, we will gather in the Parish Hall for a reception honoring the Bishop and our newly confirmed members of Trinity. I look forward to being with all of you on this special day.


